A *de facto* Standard is something that is used so widely that it is considered a standard for a given [application](#) although it has no official status. <sup>1)</sup> A *de facto* Standard is generally controlled by a corporation (Microsoft, IBM, Google, Amazon, etc) or group (Apache, Linux, Mozilla, etc).
