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CentOS (/ˈsɛntoʊs/, from Community Enterprise [Operating System](#)) is a Linux distribution that provides a free, community-supported [computing platform](#) functionally compatible with its upstream source, Red Hat Enterprise Linux (RHEL). In January 2014, CentOS announced the official joining with Red Hat while staying independent from RHEL, under a new CentOS governing board.
