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Overview

Consensus Mechanism, in DIDs, is any of a number of general-purpose **Consensus Mechanisms** that have been developed with each Dido Platform choosing the mechanism best suited for its needs. Some examples are Proof of Work (PoW), Proof of State (PoS), PoS, etc.

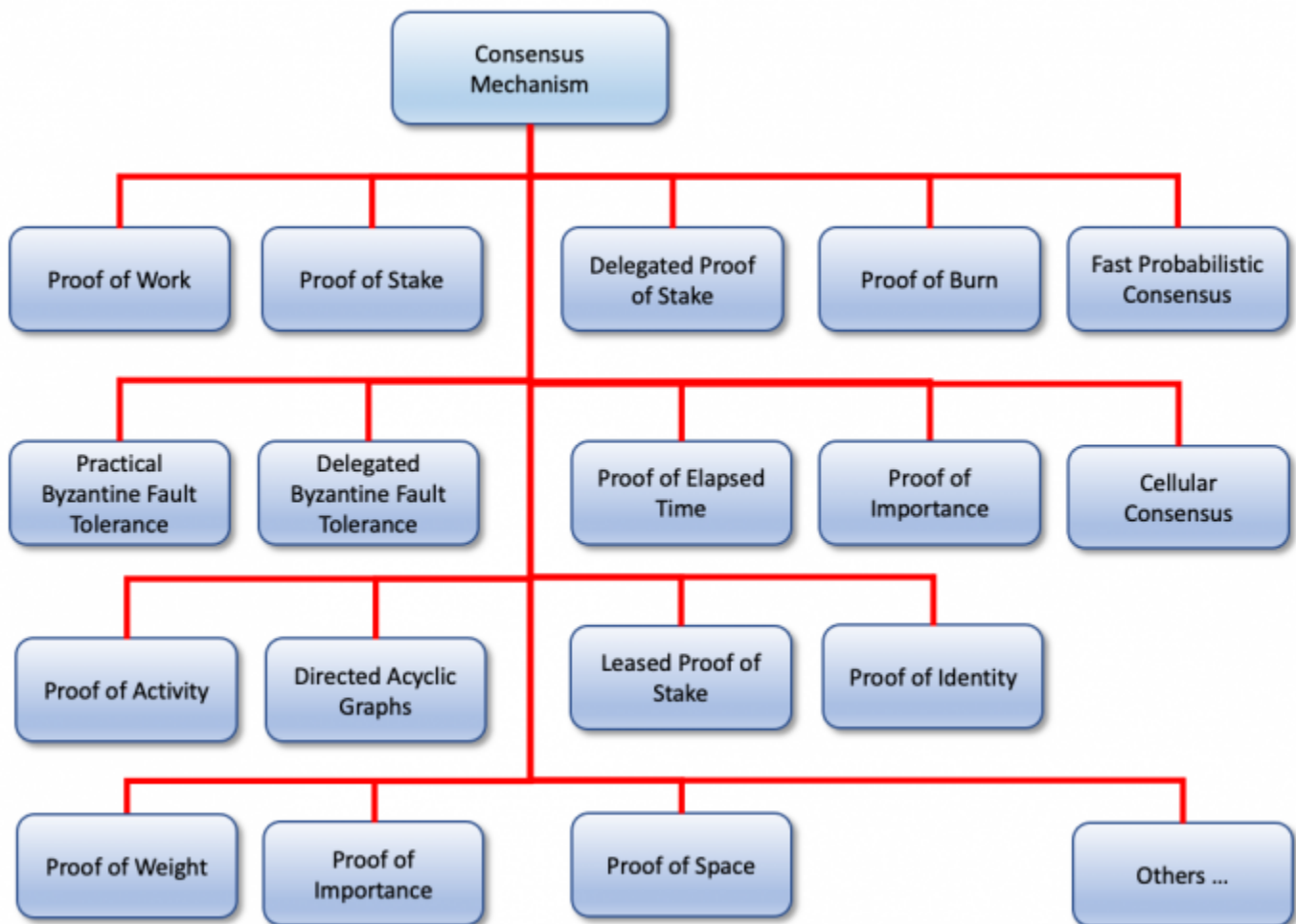


Figure 1: Some of the more common Consensus Mechanisms.
